TARNEIT PARK

There's also lots going on just down the road from the Estate. The new Tarneit Park Hub on Leakes Road adjacent to Tarneit Central Shopping Centre, is now really starting to take shape.



In great news for Westbrook residents, anchor tenant Bunnings, which opened in 2021 in Stage 1 of the development, is soon set to be joined by a number of new large-format retail outlets.

These include The Salvos, My Car, Repco, Pet Stock and Autobarn, as well as a Fernwood Gym, a Woodland Early Learning childcare facility, and three food and restaurant operators – 7/11, Starbucks and Hungry Jacks.

There's no doubting the range of recently announced commercial and retail offerings at the Hub will benefit the whole community and attract even more people to one of Western Melbourne's fastest growing areas.

Watch this space and we'll keep you posted about when the new outlets will be open for business!

THE WESTBROOK COMMUNITY FUND IS BACK AGAIN IN 2023

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At Westbrook we're committed to help nurture a vibrant, healthy local community. So, we're delighted to announce that applications for the 2023 Westbrook Community Fund will open 20th July 2023.

An annual initiative of Dennis Family Corporation, this year there's over \$30,000 in financial grants available to community and not-for-profit organisations in the Truganina, Tarneit and Williams Landing areas to assist a wide range of local projects.

Since it first launched in 2002, the Corporation's Community Fund program has distributed almost \$950,000 in grants across various residential estates in Victoria and Southeast Queensland, including over \$34,500 awarded to 23 organisations from the City of Wyndham in 2022, numbering amongst them Truganina Thunder Football Club, Dohertys Creek College Community Hub, Wyndham Little Buddies Toy Library, the African-Australian Family and Parenting Support Services Inc, Victorian Bangladeshi Community Foundation and various local sporting clubs.


DESIGN TRENDS: **EVERYTHING OLD** *IS NEW AGAIN!*

When it comes to style, trends come and go. And right now, nostalgia is having a moment in design of all kinds.

Over the past couple of years, nostalgic elements have begun to creep into many facets of daily life – from fashion to furniture and even the music we stream, as we've watched brands and designers seek out a sense of comfort by reinventing the familiar.

This is especially evident in the upsurge of vintage styles which have gained mainstream popularity across furniture, fashion and design via social channels like Instagram and Pinterest, further fuelled by a heightened focus on sustainability, with many of us proactively seeking vintage styles and an evocative feel in our homes.

So, how to incorporate nostalgic elements in your own home?



One way to do this is to incorporate design elements that evoke a specific period. This could include one or more feature items of furniture like a distinctive mid-20th century Bauhaus style lounge or dining setting, or a striking antique mirror or rug.

For a quick fix, opt for textiles, paint colours, smaller furniture pieces, and wallpaper inspired by a particular era. For example nothing says 1970's chic like brightly coloured geometric Marimekko fabrics or check out websites like Etsy for good value pieces featuring popular patterns and designs by William Morris (Arts & Crafts movement) and Florence Broadhurst (1960s revival).

For an eclectic approach, mix past and present using individual vintage pieces from various eras mixed in with contemporary modern neutral tones, creating a timeline of sorts from the past to the present. Think old rugs, artwork or an antique side table paired with modern sofas or a dining setting, or a much-loved quilt on a bed.

Another great trick is to take an item of furniture like a '70s style sofa in a throwback shape but do it in a fresh colour, or vice versa – a great option for reviving an old, or tired items otherwise consigned to the trash and treasure pile!

The most important thing to remember is that iconic pieces often define an era and will impact the character of the space, so be smart about it. The goal is always to evoke pleasant memories and associations in order to create a familiar and confortable environment that you're happy with.
