THE FUTURE LOOKS BRIGHT FOR SUNS FOOTBALL NETBALL CLUB



As President of the Suns Football Netball Club for almost 20 years, Graeme Clark has been a key part of the Wyndham community.

In 2022, Graeme openly sought more female players to join the senior and junior teams.

“We’ve now got a senior women’s side and three female senior netball sides, brought about last year,” he said.

“Being able to have a lot more women around the club is a great feeling, for sure.

“The inclusion is fantastic.”

Graeme has chosen to step down as President, passing the gauntlet to longtime Wyndham community member Gordon Rae.

“I’m doing a bit of work behind the scenes as a consultant, having conversations with different people, helping out when needed, giving advice on different scenarios, mentoring some of the newer people on different roles – anything I can help with,

having been involved in the club for so many years,” Graeme commented.

“We’re very excited about what’s happening over the next four or five years.”

The Suns are coming off a successful season, where the newly recruited Senior women’s team and two of the three women’s netball sides played in a final.

“It’s a fantastic achievement that shows where the women’s teams are,” enthused Graeme.

“Both seniors and reserves men’s teams played finals, senior women’s played finals, and one of our junior sides made it to the finals as well.

“For a small club, it’s a great achievement.”

Outside of games, a particular highlight of the season was the Council installing lights around the Goddard Street Reserve after eight years of lobbying by the club, and new lights to illuminate the surrounding walking path. The lights ensure safety for the community members who frequent the area.



As the club's key manager and recruiter, Graeme sought out new players for the women's side by word of mouth, open communication, and liaising with friends of friends who may be interested in playing.

"Some ladies wanted a fresh beginning, a new start in football, so we met with a group of them, and they opted to come across to us," Graeme explained.

The club hopes to recruit enough players to fill a junior girls' side, an under 12s side, and a 14s side in football.

"We'll also look to expand into junior netball next year."

The club constantly seeks new members, with Graeme urging that every potential player is equally assessed.

"It's not a 'first in, best dressed' situation – everyone's welcome," he promises.

"As the year goes by, we work with players to ensure everyone's getting a fair and equal amount of game time."

Graeme recommends visiting the club in person and speaking to players or members of the club if you'd like to get involved.

"If you're encouraging a child in the juniors to play, there's always parents and committee members around," Graeme recommends.

"If it's someone looking to play senior footy, whether men's or women's, the coach is very approachable."

"We really appreciate the support and commitment that Dennis Family and the Westbrook estate have shown to the football club," Graeme ends.

"Without their support, a lot of the things that we've been able to achieve wouldn't have been possible."

As we move through 2025, four new interior design trends are making their way into the spotlight.

Whether you're drawn to bold and playful aesthetics, immersive colour schemes, earthy warmth, or connecting to nature, there's something here to inspire your next design transformation.



Dopamine Decor: Spark Joy

Dopamine Decor is all about creating interiors that spark joy and reflect individuality through colour, pattern, and personal touches. This trend prioritises what makes you feel good rather than following rigid design rules.

Colour: Find the 'complementary' colour to your favourite hue – the opposite shade on the colour wheel.

Patterns: Adding floral, geometric, or abstract patterns through artwork, fabrics, and floor rugs creates a sense of whimsy and self-expression.

Texture: Use wallpaper and patterned hardware to express personal touches. Mixing textures like linen, velvet, and leather creates diversity and interest.



Colour Drenching: For Warming Interiors

Colour Drenching creates an immersive atmosphere by applying a single hue across walls, ceilings, and furniture for those who love bold and cohesive interiors. This offers a dramatic and seamless effect for a sophisticated ambiance.

Colour: Jewel tones like deep blues, emerald greens, and Citrine yellow lead the way in this trend.

Patterns: Pairing blonde-toned timber and a warm brown floor rug will help tie the space together, while experimenting with different fabric textures and patterns can add layers of visual interest.

Texture: To prevent overwhelming the space, incorporate subtle variations in saturation.



Mocha Mousse: Pantone Colour of the Year

With the release of Pantone's Colour of the Year, Mocha Mousse, the warm brown tone is set to be a defining trend for 2025 and beyond. Its neutral base and warmth provide a timeless quality that ensures longevity in interior design.

Base colour: Whether used on walls, cabinetry, furnishings, or statement décor, Mocha Mousse integrates with existing designs and offers a strong foundation for layering.

Neutrals: Pair Mocha Mousse with warm whites, creams, and taupes, as well as tonal timber finishes.

Materials: Brown-toned hardware like bronze and antique brass add a sophisticated touch.



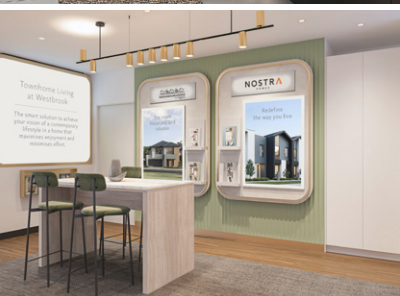
Nod to Nature: Bringing Wellness Inside

Materials: Pair natural stones and pebble mosaics with rustic timbers and tonal hardware to create a spa-like sanctuary in the bathroom.

Furniture: Warm wooden vanities, open shelving, and textured timber or stone countertops add character.

Colours: Bring this trend to life with moody charcoals, dark greens, lighter travertine, and taupe. These colours can be introduced through laminates, tiles, stone, towels, and décor.

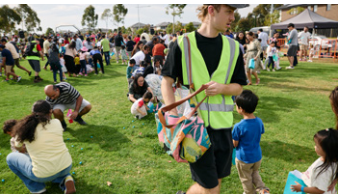
